Cumberland, Mar 23 —Rev Lewis Chambers, aged eighty-seven years, the oldest clergyman in the vicinity of Hancock Md, is dead at the home of his daughter, Mrs Amanda Pott near Big Cove For more than fifty years he was a member of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows.

Hagerstown, Mar 23 —Gen Joseph Fulton Boyd, purchasing agent of the Cumberland Valley Railroad, formerly superintendent died at his home at Chambersburg to day, of paralysis aged seventy five. He was born in Ohio When but twenty one years he began his career as a railroader He has held various positions of trust with the Louisville and Nashville Railroad, Memphis and Ohio Railroad St. Louis and Southeastern and for thirty years was superintendent of the Cumberland Valley Railroad He enlisted in the Union army in 1861 was made captain, and after a brilliant military career was in 1866 created brigadier general He married Kate Gordon of Cincinnati, who with five children, survives He died on his wedding anniversary.
